ILS is confident that the parent representation providers who will benefit from this funding (\$500,000 over a period of three years) will significantly advance, in their respective jurisdictions in a myriad of creative ways, the quality of representation in Family Court Act Article 10 proceedings, as is required by the RFP. "Quality legal representation for parents in these proceedings is of heightened importance since the individuals targeted are disproportionately poor, Black and Indigenous, and typically lack the information, resources, and social capital necessary to respond effectively to government action which often includes temporary or permanent removal of a child from the parent."
